Building on the packet, our monthly Sharing Circle provides an opportunity for us to connect as a community as we explore life's gifts and various callings from our UU faith. Matthew Mixon's bio:

Matthew started practicing meditation in 2011 and facilitating meditation groups 2014. Matthew has studied with Sri Lankan monks of the Theravada tradition and Vietnamese monks of the Mahayana Zen tradition. Professionally, Matthew has trained and worked in environments facilitating weekly meditation groups, day long Meditation retreats, Mindfulness based Group and Individual Support within Behavioral Health assisting people overcoming challenges with mental health, developmental conditions, drug & alcohol recovery, and grief support. Matthew is a dedicated practitioner of meditation and has made a personal commitment to be available to assist all those interested in beginning and furthering their path of self-discovery and freedom from suffering.

Return to in-person gatherings?

The UU Valdosta board is closely following Covid-19 risk levels (CovidActNow.org) in the Valdosta area and will determine when it is appropriate to begin services and other gatherings in-person. Our decisions are guided by science and data and the following principles:

- Inclusivity and justice: We will not exclude people and will take special care that equity and anti-oppression are centered in our decision making.
- Safety: We will do our utmost to keep our people and the community safe. We will not contribute to community spread.
- **Community matters**: We value our community and being together. As soon as it is safe to gather in an inclusive way, we will.
- Pro-science: We support vaccination for those who are able as a scientific, reasonable, and loving decision. You protect yourself and others. We believe that vaccines are effective and trust the scientists who have worked on them. We accept the evidence that wearing masks has greatly reduced the spread of COVID-19 and other respiratory infections.

As this newsletter is being prepared, case-rates are increasing in the local area due to the Omicron variant, which has put Lowndes County back into the "Severe" risk level, the highest level of risk: https://covidactnow.org/ In addition, the vaccination rate in Lowndes County remains very low, at about 37%. Please make plans to stay safe while out in the community!
