Sunday, May 14 – Kimberly Tanner and Carol Stiles, "UU White Supremacy Teach-In"

Today's service will have a different format as we join hundreds of other UU congregations around the country who are holding a Teach-In about white supremacy during Sunday services in late April or early May. We will use materials developed by Black Lives of UU and other resources to raise awareness of racism and white supremacy. As Black Lives of UU states "in order for us to be more effective at tackling the white supremacy beyond our walls, we must also identify ways in which systems of supremacy and inequality live within our faith and our lives." Come prepared to participate in this teach-in during the service.

Sunday, May 21 – Shared Service with Serenity Christian Church

This Sunday is our annual shared service with Serenity Christian Church. Rev. Howard and Rev. Rose will do a pulpit exchange with Rev. Howard speaking at Serenity and Rev. Rose speaking at our church.

Serenity Church is about 1/3 mile down Lee, on the left at the corner of Lee and Moore. They have a large parking lot at the back of the church.

The Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA) General Assembly (GA) will be held in New Orleans June 21-25 this year. The GA has not been in our area of the country since 2011 and is not scheduled to return anytime soon. So, if you've ever entertained the idea of attending one, this is a wonderful opportunity.

I attended my first GA in 2003 in Boston, MA. Since then I've attended about every other year. I highly recommend experiencing a GA for anyone interested in furthering their understanding of our faith tradition. It's a great opportunity to see the governance of our UUA in action during the various plenary sessions. Sue Bailey and Lars Leader will be the designated delegates for our congregation this year.

But anyone can attend! For those not designated as voting delegates, there are dozens of workshops on a wide variety of interesting and informative topics that take place concurrent with the plenary sessions. And these are open to anyone registered for GA. There's also meditation and other spiritual practices, lectures, concerts, coffeehouses, and many other activities to educate and entertain. Something for just about every interest of a discerning UU.

During GA there are also two main worship services - the Service of the Living Tradition on Thursday and a Sunday morning worship service to close out the Assembly. Both are attended by several thousand UUs. There is no way to describe the energy and enthusiasm generated by 5000+ of our most faithful worshipping together and singing Spirit of Life.
